Background

Like many active money managers, Third Day Advisors founder **Ken Whitley** began his career in an industry unrelated to investments and asset management. Ken graduated from college in 1981 with a B.S. in Computer Science, and has spent his career in the fast-paced high-tech industry. After working for various employers in the high-tech industry, Ken joined a small software company. When this company's software product was acquired by Intel Corporation in 1997, an offer of employment came with the deal. Ken accepted the offer and worked full-time for Intel until January of 2007. Ken now is a full-time money manager.

Having enjoyed the fruits of the 1990s high tech boom, Ken built up a nest egg that he then sought to invest. He began studying the market in his spare time, and after much trial and error, developed a sophisticated model for trading the Nasdaq 100 Index. In November of 2001, Ken completed back-testing of his system to 1995, and concluded that it had a great deal of potential. He then started trading his own money using his system's signals. More recently, Ken has applied his signals to other major market indexes.

In 2003, Ken brought in Doug Fisher and his wife Angela as additional partners in Third Day. Doug, who is still an employee of Intel, provides trading backup and marketing assistance while Angela is responsible for day-to-day generation of the trading signal.

The Third Day S&P Plan

Aggressive investors often seek out programs that can utilize leverage and short positions in an effort to enhance performance. The Third Day S&P Plan fills this need by providing investors with a leveraged long and short exposure to the S&P 500 Index. The S&P Plan is traded based on the same systematic trading model that Third Day uses for all of its investment programs, except that allocations are made to a leveraged S&P 500 Index mutual fund. Of course, there are no guarantees of profitability.

Third Day's long/short equity signal is a proprietary blend of momentum, trend-following and overbought/oversold indicators. There are eight basic indicators that Ken uses to analyze the market, with a number of sub-indicators that also factor into each trading decision. Each indicator "votes" on whether to be long, short or neutral in the market. The relative strength of each indicator then determines to what extent the Third Day program will be invested in the market. The model is 100% "mechanical" (ie – systematic) though Ken does reserve the right to override his system's signals in the case of a national emergency or other unusual circumstances.

The investment vehicles used are the **Rydex S&P 500 2 x Strategy** and **Rydex Inverse S&P 500 2 x Strategy** mutual funds. These funds are part of the Rydex Dynamic class of funds that seek to provide investment returns that correlate to 200% of the daily performance of the S&P 500 Index, with the OTC 2 x Strategy Fund providing a positive correlation (long) and the Inverse OTC 2 x Strategy Fund providing a negative correlation (short).

These specialized mutual funds allow Third Day to be "**long**" or "**short**" the market depending on its signals. Also, unlike most other mutual funds, the Rydex Dynamic funds allow Third Day to

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trade in or out of a fund two times per day, once at 10:45 AM Eastern time and again as of the close of business at 4:00 PM Eastern time. This can be a big advantage.

The S&P Plan can allocate up to 100% of the account value to a trade, but maximum allocations are rare. The program is anticipated to be in cash (money market fund) approximately 30% to 40% of the time, based on historical performance. As a general rule, the S&P Plan trade will be 1.33 times the long or short allocation determined for Third Day's Aggressive Strategy. Thus, if the Aggressive strategy is 40% invested in the Nasdaq 100 2X Rydex fund, the S&P Plan will be invested approximately 53% in the S&P 500 2X Rydex fund.

The Third Day S&P Plan does not currently employ any traditional stop-loss techniques to automatically exit losing trades. This is another reason why the program should primarily be considered by **aggressive** investors who are comfortable with high volatility and significant periodic drawdowns.

Performance Evaluation

While the S&P Plan uses the same trading signal as that of the Third Day's other investment programs, it has been actually trading only since September of 2006. Therefore, the actual track record for this program does not extend as far back as that of Third Day's other strategies.

Even so, it is important to remember that it uses the very same trading signal that has been in place since 2001. This trading signal applied to different market indexes can result in significantly different performance, depending upon the market environment and volatility.

For example, Third Day's Aggressive Strategy (using the Third Day signal to trade the Nasdaq 100 Index) lost -7.06% in 2007, while the S&P Plan gained over 15% using the very same trading signal on S&P 500 Index funds over the same period of time. Of course, there is no guarantee that future performance will be similar.

The Trading Platform

As noted above, Third Day is a small shop, with both Ken and Angela working from home, so you may wonder how Third Day can trade effectively.

Fortunately the Rydex family of mutual funds has developed a trading platform custom-made for active money managers like Third Day. Each trading day, Ken and Angela both input the market data into the system and generate a trading signal. Angela then accesses the Rydex online trading program and enters the necessary trades.

The Rydex online trading platform allows Third Day to execute trades for an entire group of clients with just one trading instruction. Thus, the trading system automatically allocates the appropriate portion of each similarly situated client's account to the proper index mutual fund, or to the money market if the signal is neutral. For backup, Ken and Angela each have their own Internet service and work in separate locations, so simultaneous outages are less likely. Plus, Third Day can also call in trades to Rydex should both Ken and Angela lose Internet access.

Client funds are held in Rydex mutual fund accounts, and investors have access to their accounts through the Rydex website. Rydex issues quarterly statements, and also provides year-end tax reports.

The minimum account size for the Third Day S&P Plan is \$50,000. Rydex charges no custodial fee. Management fees are billed quarterly in arrears, based on the following annual percentages for various assets under management:

\$50,000 to \$10,000,000.....2.50%
\$10,000,00 and above.....2.00% (entire account)

Conclusion

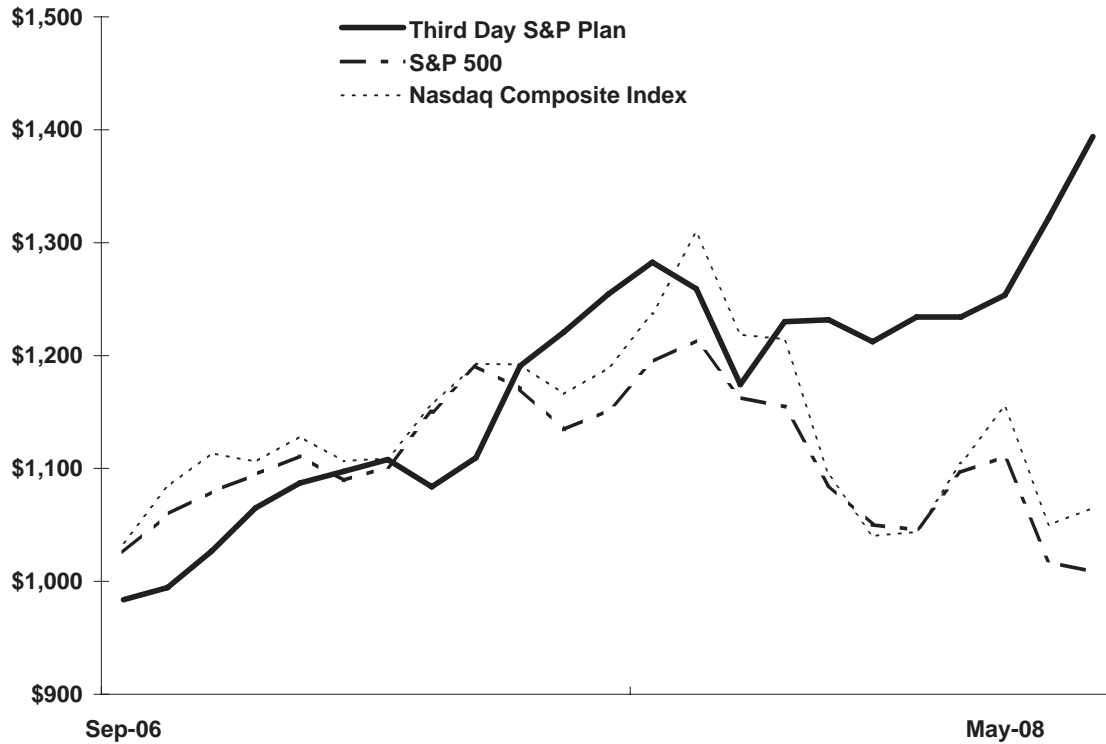
The Third Day S&P Plan may be an attractive option for aggressive investors who want both a leveraged long and short exposure in the market. **The most notable thing about this program is that it has shown impressive results since its inception. Of course, past performance is not necessarily indicative of future performance.**

The short-term trading nature of the Third Day S&P Plan will mean that there will be a significant amount of activity in your account. In addition, all gains or losses will be short-term in nature, so this program may not be the most suitable option if tax efficiency is a priority.
